


MAKE A BIRTHDAY CONTRIBUTION

Dr. Bob Smith



On May 13, 1935, Dr. Bob met Bill W., a recovering alcoholic. Through talking to him, Smith stopped drinking. Yet, after a month of sobriety, he relapsed when going to a convention in Atlantic City. He returned to Akron and on June 10, had his last drink, a beer, given to him by Bill W. to help settle the doctor's nerves before a surgery. Dr. Bob never picked up again and that day, 6-10-35, is the official founding of Alcoholics Anonymous, a day when one alcoholic helped another get and remain sober.

"Our very lives, as ex-problem drinkers, depend upon our constant thought of others and how we may help meet their needs." **(Step 12)** This quote underscores the importance of selflessness and service to others as a fundamental aspect of maintaining sobriety.

"To be gravely affected, one does not necessarily have to drink a long time nor take the quantities some of us have." **(Chapter 3)** This quote reminds readers that alcoholism can affect anyone, regardless of the duration or quantity of their drinking.

"We are people who normally would not mix. But there exists among us a fellowship, a friendliness, and an understanding which is indescribably wonderful." **(Chapter 5)**

This quote highlights the unique bond and support system that develops among members of AA, despite their diverse backgrounds.
